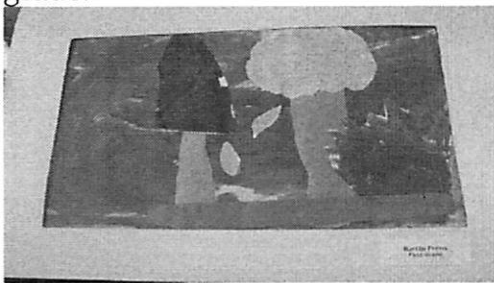

MINUTES

Minutes of the District Health and Safety Committee on Wednesday, May 13, 2015 in the HS LMC Conference Room at 1:45 p.m. Members absent: Karen Kut, Sandy Ewert, John Polito, Tony Santoro Dean Hendershott, Hunter McCulloch and Sherry Askey.

Old Business

- Injury report review – The report was reviewed from February, March and April. Mike Centrone asked if helmets are required for Ski Club. Answer: Mandatory for Middle School students, strongly recommended for High School students.
- Drills – The last 4 fire drills for the school year need to be completed at all buildings.
- Smart School Bond Act Update – The Implementation Guidance Document is now available and the district can begin the process of applying for the approximately \$1.5 million grant available to us.
- 12th Annual Safe Schools Initiative Seminar at UB on March 19th – Dave, John Spink, Sherry Bennett and Ivan attended. John Spink said he would like to have the administrative team watch the DVD produced by Amherst School on emergency response. We need to schedule some time during an upcoming meeting.
- School Safety Planning Regional Meeting on March 25th – The meeting with the NYS Troopers and State Education Dept. was held in Batavia. Dave, Steve Dziak and Tony attended.
- Utica National 2015 School Risk Management Seminar on April 15th – This is Utica's annual spring meeting. The title this year is "Be Aware, Be Prepared, Empowering educators to respond to risks". Some of the administrative team attended and we were awarded the "Titanium with Honors" for our health and safety efforts. The district received a \$500 rebate check as part of the award.

- Annual Facility Walk-thru – We reviewed the notes of the walk-thru conducted on April 21st beginning at 9:00 A.M. in the HS lobby. Members who participated: Gina, Steve Lane, Steve Dziak, Ivan, Karen Kut, Brian Fugle and Dave.
- Respiratory illness/ flu update – We have not seen a major impact in any of the buildings from the flu.

New Business

- DWI simulation drill May 27 – The HS along with help from many agencies will be hosting the DWI drill. The drill is performed by emergency services throughout the county and is rotated each year to one of the 4 schools in the county. Along with this drill, John Spink mentioned that the HS is participating in the "Click it or Ticket" program and they have a texting and driving simulator coming on May 18th.
- Intrastate Mutual Aid Program – Dave explained the new program and how mutual aid agreements between municipalities are no longer necessary. All municipalities and agencies are now covered under this new law.
- Round Table – John Spink mentioned that Jay Hoy was inquiring about getting access badges to the schools to be carried in the Trooper cars. Jay has been reassigned downstate so will address this when he comes back. Michelle Pitkin needs additional storage space in the Chemistry lab to accommodate more students. Dave will look at and address this request. Dave talked about the Rapid Responder program and asked Greg if the county is participating. Greg said that it is a school owned program – nothing needs to be done at the county level to participate. BOCES has a coser now to provide the service. Dave will look into the program more before signing us up. Steve Lane said this was his last meeting as he is retiring from the Board of Education and he thanked everyone for their hard work over the years and encouraged us to keep it up.
- Next meeting – Fall 2015
