I. Annual Meeting – Internal Claims Auditor

Catherine Forgnone met with the Audit Committee to review the 2011-12 fiscal year. The following were reviewed: inventory, tracking of materials and equipment, theft, and purchase order correction. Procedures were reviewed and strengthened on each area of concern.

II. Audit Plan – Freed Maxick & Battaglia

Kathryn Barrett met with the Audit Committee to review the Audit Plan. She indicated the engagement team will remain the same. Preliminary testing will be arranged in May/June. Audit objectives were reviewed. Concerns regarding GASB 63, Risk Assessment, Extra-curricular Funds, and Medicaid Moratorium were discussed.

III. Risk Assessment – Raymond F. Wager, CPA, PC

Thomas Lauffer met with the Audit Committee to review the Financial Risk Assessment prepared as of 06/30/12. Trend of concerns becoming less frequent continues. Business staff is available throughout the audit process. State aid revenues flat-lined and are not keeping pace with contractual expenses. Very good that the district continues to work with their financial consultants to project the financial environments. Corrective actions were reviewed. Firewall protection was discussed. Recommend to accept the Assessment.

IV. Annual Review of Audit Committee Charter

Reviewed the Charter and recommend accepting as is.

Minutes of the District Health and Safety Committee on Wednesday May 9, 2012 in the Prospect faculty Room at 1:45 p.m. Members absent: Karen Tomidy, Kelly Bissell, John Polito, Jeff Huber, Regina Lepsch, Sheri Travis, John Spink, Brea Trader, Dennis Leyden and Curtis Fearington

Old Business

- Injury report review – The report was reviewed from February through April. There was discussion related to a bike riding accident, cafeteria incident and weight lifting injury. Most were athletic/ phys ed. related injuries.
- Drills – The simulated car crash DWI drill has been cancelled for this year. We have not practiced going to the new evacuation site for Sheldon Elementary. Dave will talk to Karen Tomidy about doing that this spring. It was mentioned that this is the time of year for the lockdown drill at the HS/ MS.
- PEP Grant update – We are continuing to collect data. Some new components of the grant are coming up – outdoor sand volleyball courts, outdoor basketball courts and an outdoor team building course.
- Capital Project Information – No new progress as the energy audit is still at NYSERDA for review. Dave mentioned that the additions that were built in 2000 are now 12 years old and we must be considering roof replacements on those areas in the next 3-5 years.

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- Facilities walk through – was completed on May 8th with a couple of items – an unattended open outside door at MS tech and wedged open classroom doors.
- Utica National meeting and Excellence award – Dave gave an overview of the last regional meeting hosted by Utica National. At that meeting the district was also awarded the "Titanium with honors" award and \$500 for the health and safety efforts.

B.) New Business

- The Partners for Prevention are doing a presentation to the HS students as a continuation of the drug awareness training they conducted for parents and community members last fall.
- The AEDs in the district are going to need upgrades or replacement soon. The Administrators are getting the CPR/ AED refresher on May 10th.
- Round Table – Tony asked if the folks at the Medical center ever complain about the traffic through their parking lot. No complaints have ever come to the district so far.
- This was the final meeting of the 2011/ 2012 school year. Thank you to all members of the district Health and safety Committee.
