Board of Education Report
June 23, 2016

- Plans are underway for summer curriculum work for teachers. A few areas of focus include updating/reviewing the science and social studies curriculum to align to the Next Generation Science Standards and the New York State K-12 Social Studies Framework.
- Released 2016 Grade 3-8 Test Questions – at the end of May the State Education Department released 75 percent of the ELA and math questions that counted toward students' scores. Additionally, 100 percent of the constructed-response questions from these tests, including the question itself and an item map that provide the standard(s) measured by the questions. Taken together, the test questions, instructional reports, and student responses can help teachers make informed decisions about curriculum and plan for the upcoming school year. Because this information was released earlier than ever before, we will now be able to utilize this data as I collaborate with teachers and departments not only during the summer, but throughout the school year.
- As the school year closes, I am finalizing meetings and discussions with the mentor teachers and mentee teachers as to the impact of our Mentor Program on their school year. Participation in a mentoring program is a mandated requirement for teachers holding initial certification. The purpose of the mentoring requirement is to provide a new teacher with support in order to gain skillfulness and more easily make the transition to one's first professional teaching experience and/or transition to a new school district.
