Code of Conduct 2nd Read

Please bring the documentation regarding the Code of Conduct revisions which was provided in your April 24, 2017 board meeting packet.

The attached page outlines the one change that was discussed April 24th – it is underlined in red ink.

- A. First Offense: Automatic notification of authorities and/or involvement of our School Resource Officer. Consequences may include five days out-of-school suspension, a possible Superintendent's Hearing, possible utilization of Wyoming County Youth Court

VANDALISM/PROPERTY DAMAGE: Causing willful damage to school property or the property of others.

- A. First Offense: Replacement cost, in-school suspension and notification of parents.
B. Second Offense: Replacement cost, in-school suspension or out-of-school suspension.

* NOTE: Depending on severity, may result in criminal charges being filed.

DRUGS (INCLUDING ALCOHOL / DRUG PARAPHERNALIA)

Consumption: A student who has consumed ANY amount of drugs or alcohol is deemed to be "under the influence."

Possession: A student who is found to be in possession of drugs, alcohol or paraphernalia

- A. First Offense: Out-of-school suspension and notification of parents. Possible notification of the proper law enforcement. Substance abuse counseling could be recommended by the administration.

***Add: Possible Superintendent hearing**

THEFT

- A. First Offense: Replacement cost, in-school suspension and notification of parents.
B. Second Offense: Replacement cost, multiple in-school suspensions, notification of parents.

***Add: Pending severity, possibly contacting law enforcement**

Add: STUDENT USE OF PERSONAL ELECTRONIC DEVICES IN THE MIDDLE & HIGH SCHOOL:

Students may bring their own personal electronic devices, including but not limited to, cell phones, iPods, MP2 players, iPads, tablets, or laptops, to school. These devices may be carried with them and used in designated places in the building, including the cafeterias, media centers, and hallways. Students may talk on their phones in the cafeterias, or in the MS/HS office or front foyer with permission. In the classroom, it is expressly prohibited to use electronic devices, unless expressly allowed by the teacher. Students may not use their electronic devices to record a picture, video, or audio of another person without the person's consent.

Students are not permitted to use any form of information technology, including their own personal electronic devices to, intimidate, harass, or threaten others. This type of harassment is generally referred to as cyber bullying. If a student violates this prohibition, then he/she is subject to discipline under this provision and/or any other provision in the District Code of Conduct that may be applicable to the circumstance involved.
